

Thank you for your inquiry about our CSA/subscription garden program. We have been operating our garden as a U-Pick vegetable and flower garden, now entering our sixth season. We also distribute our fresh produce through CSA/subscriptions and welcome your participation. I hope to be able to tailor your subscription to your needs and here are some guidelines for doing that.

Our season is July 1 to October 31. The produce is offered in weekly packages. The package is \$15 x 15 weeks = \$225 + \$ 25 for delivery = \$250. Payment may be made in full prior to the first delivery, or half (\$125). Early payment will insure your CSA subscription and help our farm as we plant your vegetables. If you would like to come to the garden on our open days we can make that work as part of your subscription also. As for deliveries, I can deliver in the Britton Road, Silver Beach and Lakeway areas on Thursday morning. We can also discuss arrangements to suit your needs and yes you are welcome at our farm

We have abundant varieties of vegetables and flowers and yes, Strawberries all summer long. Below are a few lists that I have made up from our offerings. I have tried to group them in order of the season's availability:
